Dear Pro Veritas Law,

I am a lawyer in Redwood City, California. I represent NorCal Music & Arts Center, which is a private music school and recital venue in Sunnyvale. I confirm receipt of your initial demand letter and subsequent demand letter claiming violations of various State and Federal laws concerning my client's website and music education platform. You are directed to cease and desist contacting my client, and send me all further communications.

In summary, your "client's" frivolous claims are denied in full. Don't waste our time with this again unless you file an actual case, which we look forward to resolving on a motion to dismiss as well as with a wire fraud/mail fraud complaint to the FBI.
